Long Service Recognition

Purpose – To recognize Paramedic Association of New Brunswick members in good standing and with no regulatory disciplinary action in the past two (2) years, for their years of service in Paramedicine, providing patient care in New Brunswick.

Award –The award will be in the form of a medal suspended by a deep blue ribbon with a yellow stripe in the center flanked by two stripes of red and white. The claw is an 8mm tall maple leaf. The obverse is a star of life. The star of life is circumscribed with PARAMEDIC ASSOCIATION OF NEW BRUNSWICK – ASSOCIATION DES PARAMÉDICS DU NOUVEAU BRUNSWICK. The reverse displays the New Brunswick flag in crest form with the ribbon base inscribed with SPEM REDUXIT (the motto of New Brunswick meaning: hope restored) circumscribed with LONG SERVICE – LONG ÉTAS DE SERVICE and NEW BRUNSWICK – NOUVEAU BRUNSWICK.

Undress ribbon and medal ribbon for twelve years will have no jewelry. For subsequent ten-year milestones, a Star of life insignia will be added to the undress ribbon and a bar with the appropriate year in Roman Numeral will be added to the medal ribbon.

Reason for Recognition – Required years of Active Service as a Paramedic, emergency or non-emergency, in New Brunswick, current membership in the Paramedic Association of New Brunswick, no regulatory actions in the previous two (2) years, and no active regulatory investigations.

Recipient Selection – The PANB Honours and Awards Committee will review all registrations and information submitted in the Annual Registration Renewal process. Based on the information submitted, and if required, follow-up clarification, the recipient list of those who have completed the required number of years will be compiled by the committee and submitted to the PANB Board of Directors for approval.

Award Presentation – The award will be presented at the Annual PANB Awards Gala to those attaining a recognition level in the previous year. For those unable to attend the AGM and Gala, the award will be presented at a Chapter meeting or delivered by mail.

Wearing of Medal and Ribbons – The wearing of the medal and undress ribbons is dictated by the regulations related to the uniform being worn. For civilian dress, the wearer determines if it will be worn following the guidelines of the Chancellery of Honours for the Wearing of Orders, Decorations, and Medals. This medal and the bars are not recognized by the Canadian Heraldry System and must be worn on the right breast.

Should the recipient incur a regulatory action after receipt of the Long Service Recognition, the recipient will be directed not to wear the recognition for a period of two (2) years or as directed by the Association Board of Directors.

Award Review – The Long Service Recognition will be reviewed annually by the PANB Honours and Awards Committee. Recommended changes will be submitted to the PANB Board of Directors for approval.
